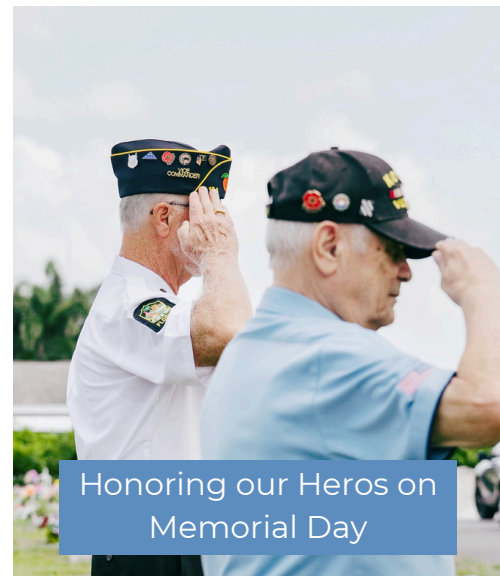


Monthly Overview

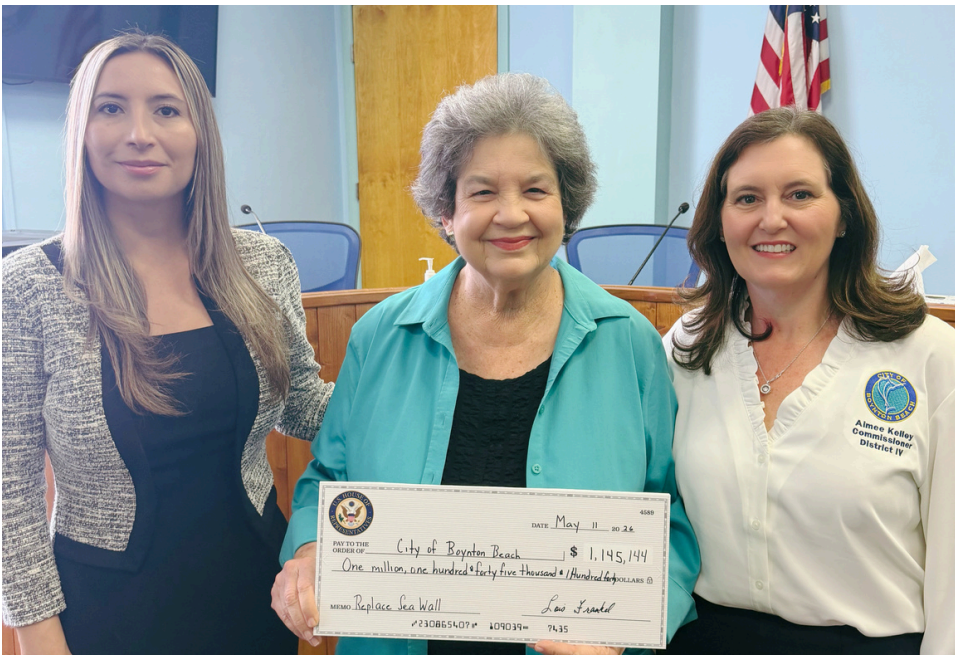
District IV Town Hall

Mental Health Awareness & Trauma Informed Care Month Proclamation

I was honored to read a proclamation declaring May as Mental Health Awareness and Trauma Informed Care Month at our May 5th Commission Meeting. This proclamation was accepted by the Boynton Beach Mental Health Committee who tirelessly serves our city. They work directly to promoting education, awareness, and direct access to behavioral health and support services for residents. Raising mental health awareness is essential to reducing stigma and ensuring that every individual feels supported, understood, and empowered to seek help when needed.





Federal Funding Secured by Representative Lois Frankel

I had the honor of joining Representative Lois Frankel at a press conference, announcing that we were receiving \$1,145,144 in federal Community Project Funding, for the Boynton Beach Seawall Project. This isn't just a number. This funding protects the Boynton Harbor Marina, an anchor of our downtown and one of the last publicly owned commercial marinas in all of Florida. When I spoke at the press conference, I wanted to make sure people understood what's really at stake: the businesses that depend on that marina, the jobs tied to it, and the more than 1,100 residents who live nearby as storms grow stronger and flood risks continue to rise. Replacing this seawall isn't a want, it's a need. I'm deeply grateful for Representative Frankel's leadership. She didn't have to choose this project, but she did and our community is safer and stronger because of it. This is what it looks like when people in office show up for the places and people they serve.



Palm Beach County League of Cities Installation

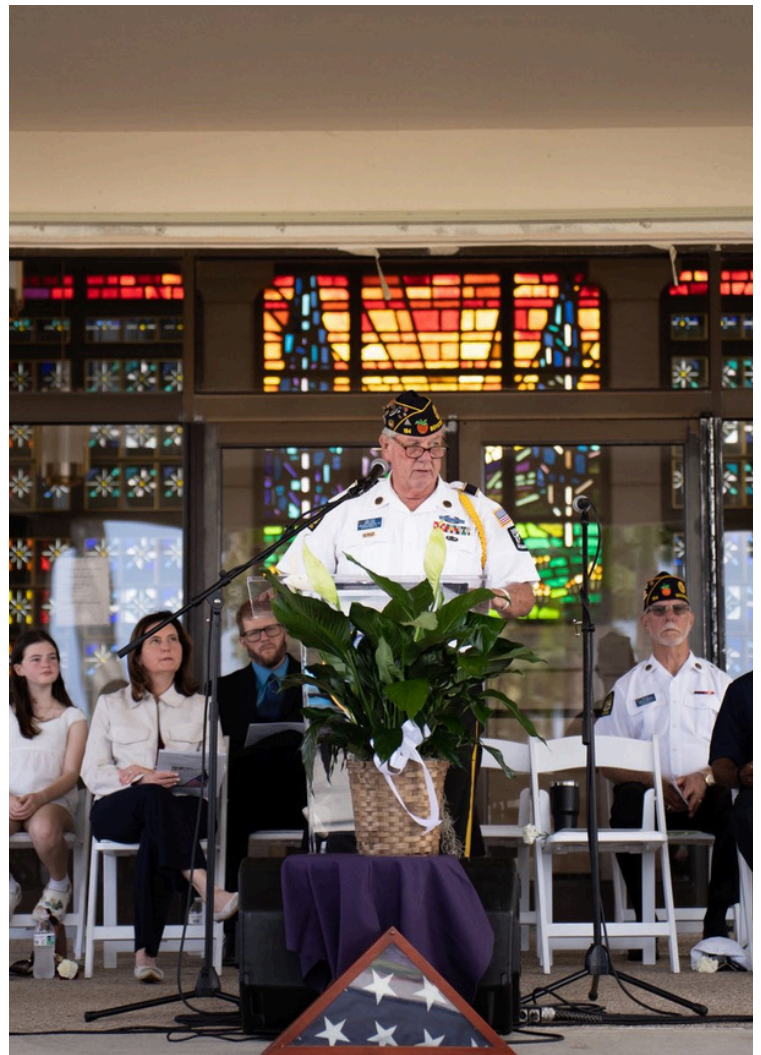

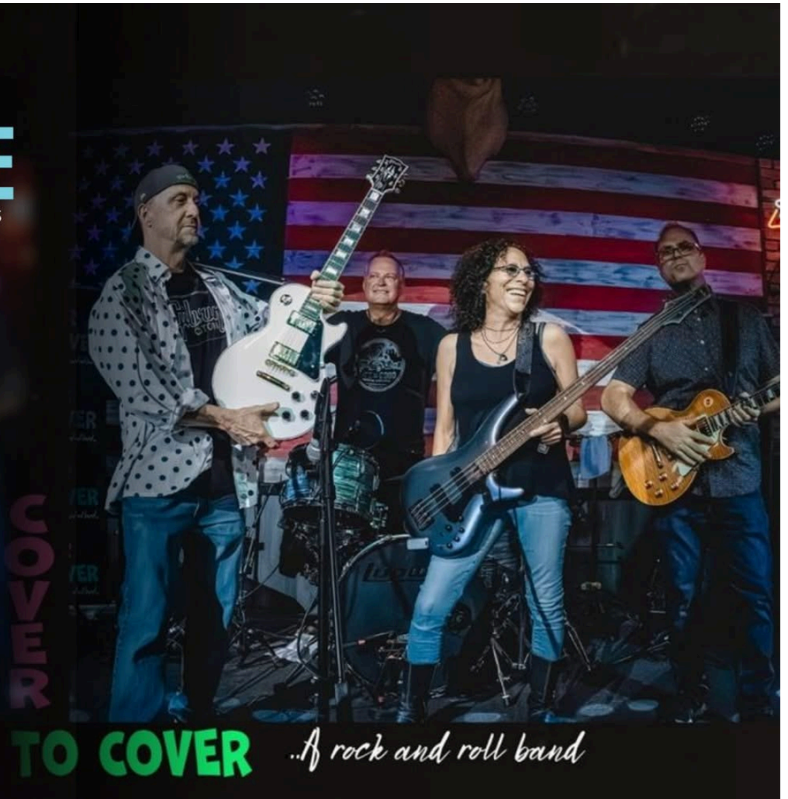
